Emergency Isolation Support (closed)	Albertans who were required to isolate or had to care for a dependent who was isolating	Benefit was a one-time payment; program now closed	No action required; program only intended to bridge gap until the Federal Government announced Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB)
Utility Payment Deferral (closed)	 Albertans experiencing financial hardship and unable to make regular payments as a result of COVID-19 Applies to bills for residential, farm and small commercial: Electricity consumers, who consume less than 250,000 kilowatt hours of electricity per year Natural gas consumers, who consume less than 2,500 gigajoules per year 	Deferral of electricity and natural gas bill until June 19, 2020 without late fees or added interest payments	Contact natural gas or electricity provider directly to arrange for deferral and repayment plan More details available: Utility Payment Deferral
Education	Applicable to Alberta	Residential education property	No action required
Property Tax	homeowners	tax rates frozen at 2019 level –
