Ontario Small Business Support Grant	 Eligible small businesses include those that: Are required to close or significantly restrict services due to provincial shutdown imposed effective 12:01AM on December 26, 2020 Have fewer than 100 employees at the enterprise level Have experienced a minimum 20% revenue decline in April 2020 compared to April 2019 Alternative months for comparing revenue decline exist for small businesses not in operation in April 2019 or April 2020. Businesses required to close prior to introduction of modified Stage 2 measures (October 10, 2020), and essential businesses permitted to operate with capacity restrictions, will not be eligible for grant 	Starting at \$10,000 for all eligible businesses, the grant will provide dollar for dollar funding to a maximum of \$20,000 to help cover decreased revenue expected as a result of the shutdown	The application can be made <u>here</u>

Main Street Relief Grant: PPE Support	To be eligible, the small business must have two to nine employees and be in one of the of the following sectors: retail, accommodation and food services, repair and maintenance, personal and laundry services, gyms and yoga studios	One-time grants of up to \$1,000	The application can be made <u>here</u>

Employer Health Tax (EHT) COVID-19 Energy Assistance Program – Small Business (CEAP-SB)	 Available to private-sector employers with annual payroll up to \$5 million Small business and registered charity electricity or natural gas customers meeting all criteria: Active account (within determined class) with an electricity distributor, a USMP or a natural gas distributor Has registered business number or charitable registration number The customer has overdue amounts owing from one or more electricity or gas bills since March 17, 2020. 	 Permanent increase to EHT exemption from \$490,000 to \$1 million for 2020 Instalment threshold doubled from \$600,000 to \$1.2 million beginning with 2021 tax year Eligible Small business and registered charity customers may qualify for a one-time CEAP-SB credit for the electricity or natural gas charges that are overdue on the date of their application for CEAP-SB, up to a maximum of \$1,500 	No action required Must apply for CEAP-SB through utility or USMP

Workplace Safety and Insurance Board (WSIB)	• Employers	 All employers covered by the WSIB's workplace insurance could defer premium reporting and payments for amounts due between March to August 2020. Repayment of deferred WSIB premiums for Schedule 1 employer, due between March to August 2020, can be made between January 1 and June 30, 2021. Repayment of deferred WSIB claim payments and administrative fees for Schedule 2 employers, due between March to August 2020, can be made between January 1 and June 30, 2021. Ontario Tools Grant	New eligible apprentices	 The government is providing funding to help new eligible apprentices purchase the equipment they need to start their careers The funding amounts will be distributed as follows: \$1,000 for those in motive power sector trades; \$600 for those in construction and industrial sector trades; \$400 for those in service trades. To be eligible for the new grant, apprentices must have: Completed level 1 training on or after April 1, 2020; An active registered training agreement; Been registered as an apprentice for at least 12 months.
